Workshop on Boarding Schools and Leadership

The term this year, as usual began with a couple of workshops for the staff to motivate them to work better. On February 18, 2016 Dr Seema Sharma conducted a workshop on 'Boarding schools and Leadership' for the entire staff.

It started with debating on the two schools of thought prevalent in the world today, one for and one against the role of Boarding schools in producing future leaders both substantiated by valid evidences. Nonetheless it was concluded that the role of boarding schools in mentoring future leaders could not be ignored. It was also put forth that when students are sent to a boarding school the expectations are of it nurturing them into self dependent, rational and well balanced individuals. However in doing so it poses several challenges to all the stakeholders and more so for the students who tend to develop survival instincts and curb natural instincts which act as deterrents towards good leadership. This may also lead students to lack in emotional intelligence, become over reactive, judgemental, poor learners and poor team players.

To counteract this, boarding schools today have to be a hub of diversity and encourage holistic development of its students. This can be achieved by making the learning environment academically challenging, having a supportive environment, good quality teachers and mentors and ample time for students to pursue extracurricular activities of their interest. There has to be a healthy pattern of life and motivated peers and opportunities to develop self discipline, maturity, autonomy, critical thinking skills and time management. Boarding schools can provide all these opportunities through a healthy and positive interaction between teachers and students and developing a strong bond of trust.

To nurture future leaders the following seven habits can be kept in mind that should be made an inherent part of the character of every boarding school student. They are:

1. Proactive
2. Having an end in mind
3. First things first
4. Think win—win
5. Understanding
6. Synergize

7. Sharpen the saw i.e. emotional, social, intellectual as well as spiritual quotients well balanced.

This will help in moving students away from mediocrity and move towards excellence and motivate students to have knowledge, desire for higher goals and establish greater self belief in themselves.
