In reply to your No 3690 dated the 12 Nov. 1881 I have the honor to report that the Specimen helmet applied for comparison with the helmet now in use in the Asylum would be suitable for the elder boys but not for the younger ones. Its material however being of Canvas work, the new helmet would probably break, & lose shape sooner than the Institution one which is of leather.

Although the shape of the new one is an improvement on that of the one in use, the new one is heavier & more expensive.

The new one costs Rs 3— whereas the one in use costs only -1/4— exclusive of the white cover which costs -1/3/9.

The Institution helmet lasts about a year.

The Canvas-work helmet would be much more apt to harbour vermin than the one in use; and when it became unserviceable it would be useless & fetch nothing at an auction.

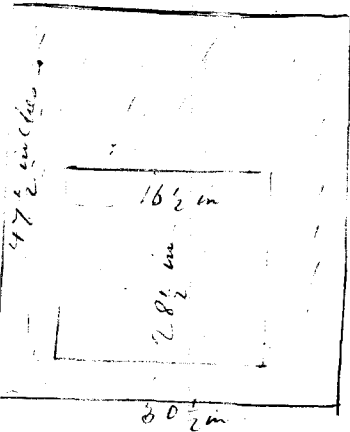

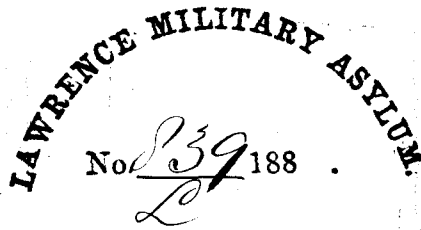
