No. 9, INDIAN BOYS' SCHOOL—

Rai Sahib Lala Labhu Ram, M.A., LL.B., E.A.C., P.C.S., an old student of the above school, whose father Lala Shadi Ram was Head Master of the school in the eighties, has given a scholarship to the Indian Boys' School in memory of his father. The following are the conditions:—

1. It should be named Master Shadi Ram Scholarship.
2. Amount of Scholarship is Rs. 2/- per mensem, to be given in cash to the boy considered most deserving with regard to School education and personal character out of those who pass the Primary Examination.
3. The Scholarship will be continued for two years to enable the recipient to complete his education in the School as it now stands.
4. The Managing Committee of the School will be the judge of the most deserving boy mentioned in Rule 1 above to get the Scholarship.
5. If that boy for some reason or other discontinues his studies at the School, the said Committee will decide to whom to give the Scholarship in his place.
6. This Scholarship will be given from 1-4-1925 and the yearly amount required for the same, which will be Rs. 24/- for the first year and Rs. 48/- for each succeeding year, will be sent by the donor to the Principal, The Lawrence Royal Military School, Sanawar, in the month of February preceding, on being intimated by letter.
7. The amount will remain in the charge of the Principal of the Lawrence Royal Military School, Sanawar, and he will see that the scholarship is disbursed monthly.
8. The personal roll of the scholarship-holder will be communicated to the donor by the Principal, L. R. M. S., Sanawar, every year.

I take this opportunity of thanking Rai Sahib Lala Labhu Ram for his generosity and congratulating him on his distinguished career.

10 School Prefects—Two for each House, will wear three stripes and a large Star—except the Senior of the 10 who will wear three stripes and a Crown and will be designated as before "Head of the School."

5 Junior Prefects—One for each House, will wear three stripes and a small Star.

10 Sergeants—Two for each House, will wear three stripes. The Drum Major will rank as one of the 10 Sergeants.

5 Corporals—One for each House, will wear two stripes.

15 Lance Corporals—Three for each House, will wear one stripe.

Houses will be divided into three sections with two School Prefects, one Junior Prefect, two Sergeants, one Corporal and three Lance Corporals attached to each House. Only **School Prefects** will sit at the Prefects' Table and have Prefectorial Powers.

In officially announcing to the Army the death of our beloved Chief, and expressing his own deep and lasting regret, Sir Claud Jacob knows that he is voicing the feeling of the whole Army.

History will recall and give its just due to Lord Rawlinson's brilliant career, a career which grew in greatness and breadth of vision with each succeeding year. He crowned an exceptionally varied and unique life by his work as Commander-in-Chief in India. He led the Army to its present state of efficiency through a period of much doubt and difficulty; it is due to his wisdom and foresight that the Army remains today a living monument of his greatness and vision.

It is, perhaps, as a fighting soldier, who held the hearts of all those who served him, that Lord Rawlinson would best wish to be remembered.

The acute sense of loss felt by all ranks of the Army is, in a measure, an expression of their knowledge of what the Empire has lost.

Lord Rawlinson will live by reason of his great public service; and will ever be example to all soldiers through his untiring devotion to the Army which he loved.

No. 1110, MEDICAL—DENTAL ATTENDANCE—

As it is not ordinarily understood by the Military Staff the circumstances entitling them and their families to free Dental Attendance, the following is published for information.

Military Staff

1. All members of the Military Staff are entitled to ordinary Dental attendance, that is, cleaning, scaling, stopping and extraction, on the recommendation of the Resident Medical Officer.

(Authority—Regs. for the Medical Services, A. R. I., para 425.)

2. Dentures will only be sanctioned in special cases and then only on a Medical certificate.

(Authority—Regs. for Medical Services, A. R. I., para 426.)

Pensioners on the Military Staff cannot be provided with dentures. (Authority—Note (1) to the above quoted paragraph.)

Repairs and renewals to Dentures are not permitted to British Soldiers below the rank of Sergeant, except under special circumstances.

(Authority—Regs. for Medical Services, A. R. I., para 427.)

Families.

1. These may be given treatment provided no charge is made for materials supplied and provided they can attend the Army Dentist.

2. Dentures will only be supplied on payment

(Authority—Regs. for Medical Services, A. R. I., para 430.)

3. The treatment is to be regarded as a privilege and not as a right. (Authority—Regs. for Medical Services, A. R. I., para 430.)

Dental attendance for all entitled persons will be arranged for by the Resident Medical Officer to whom entitled persons will apply.

Army Headquarters have been asked to permit the Military Staff to be attended to by the School Visiting Dentist. Pending this permission, the Resident Medical Officer will arrange for any of the Military Staff requiring treatment to attend at the nearest dental centre.
