#### MORE OPENINGS FOR SANAWAR BOYS.

Capy of a letter No. 27/Miscellaneous/4767 (A. G.-8), dated 10th October 1925, from the War Office, London, S. W.-1, to His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in India, Army Headquarters, India.

With reference to your letter No. 16844-M.T.-2, dated 9th July 1925, on the subject of the enlistment in India of British boys for training as tradesmen, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that they have carefully considered the proposals contained in your letter, and have decided that the proviso laid down in paragraph 5 of Army Order 190 of 1923, viz: that the beys recommended for nomination must be "resident with their parents" will be waived in the case of boys in the Lawrence Schools, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) The boys must be of pure European descent.
- (b) They must be the sons of soldiers or ex-soldiers.
- (c) They must be between the age of 14 years and 15 years 4 months on the date of arrival in this country.

The Council will also be pleased to reserve a maximum of thirty vacancies per year for boys in the Lawrence Schools, and it is proposed that these boys should be sent to this country, by public opportunity, in two batches of fifteen each. The first batch should arrive on or about 1st January each year, and the second batch on or about 1st May—i. e., on or about the dates when the training classes for newly enlisted boys commence.

Applications for nomination should be submitted so as to reach the War-Office by 1st October and 1st February for boys due to commence training in this country on 1st January and 1st May respectively.

All boys recommended for nomination must be certified by a military Medical Officer to be physically fit for enlistment, and a certificate must also be furnished that the boys have been educationally tested, and that they have attained the standard of a Second Class Certificate of Education.

Two copies of Army Form B.-59, duly completed in respect of each boy and showing the Corps he wishes to join and the trade he wishes to learn together with the two certificates above mentioned, also certificates as to character and date of birth (see paragraph 91 Regulations for Recruiting, 1922) should accompany the application.

It must be clearly understood however that owing to lack of vacancies it, may not always be possible to accept a boy for training in the trade selected by, him, and in such a case his enlistment for training in some other, trade, in which a vacancy exists, will be sanctioned.

I am to add that no action should be taken to carry out the enlistment of any boy until the necessary War Office authority (Boys Form, 4) has been received, and before proceeding with the enlistment the certificate of parents' or guardian's consent will be obtained (see paragraph 91 (iv) Regulations for Recruiting, 1922),

6. Candidates to fill the vacancies in each trade will be selected in the order of merit in which they qualify at the entrance examination.

Priority in meeting the wishes expressed by applicants regarding trade and corps will be given to candidates who passed highest in the order of merit.

- 7. The majority of the boys to be trained as Blacksmiths, Carpenters and Joiners, Electricians and Fitters will receive their training at the Boys' Technical School, Beachley Camp, Chepstow. At present, no other trades are taught at this school. The boys selected for training at this school will be enlisted for General Service, and will be appointed to one of the Corps of the Regular Army on completion of their training (i.e., when they attain the age of approximately 18 years). The remainder will be enlisted at once into one of the technical corps of the Army.
- 8. Boys will not be trained in any other trade, or in any other class (e.g., trumpeter, drummer, etc.) than that for which they were selected by the War Officer on enlistment without the concurrence of the boys themselves and that of their parents (or guardians.)
- 9. The rates of pay admissible for boys accepted for training as tradesmen will be those in force at the date of their enlistment. The rates at present authorized are as follows:—

Pay during training during training (i.e., up to the age of 18 years), 1/- a day increasing to 1/9 a day according to the progress made by the boy. On attaining the age of 18, the pay varies from 3/- a day to 5/- a day for a private according to the boy's trade and his skill in that trade. Similarly on attaining the age of 20, the pay varies from 4/- a day to 6/- a day for a private. The rates of pay for ranks higher than private are laid down in the Royal Warrant for Pay of the Army, 1922.

- 10. Ample encouragement is given and facilities exist for all kinds of sport. Holidays on full pay are given.
- 11. There are excellent prospects of promotion to Non-Commissioned and Warrant rank for soldiers who are ambitious, and who show keenness in their work. Opportunities also exist for selected Non-Commissioned Officers to be advanced to the rank of Commissioned Officer.

No. 644, RABIES—Reprint of Kasauli Station Orders—Owing to the out-break of Rabies in Kasauli, the following precautionary measures to deal with the out-break are to be adopted.

- 1. All dogs belonging to the Military will be registered, a register of such will be maintained at the Station Staff Office.
  - Civilians in the Station are requested to register their dogs.
     After the 28th July 1926 all unregistered dogs will be shot.
- 4. Any pariah found straying in the vicinity of Military cantonments will be shot.
- 5. All registered dogs to possess a collar with the registration number on it. Collarless dogs belonging to the Military will be shot after the 28th July 1926.
- 6. All dogs being exercised outside quarters should be either muzzled or on a leash.
- 7. Any dog showing symptoms of Rabies to be kept securely tied up with two steel chains for a period of ten days or such less period when obvious signs of Rabies are evidenced. A dog suffering from Rabies will die within ten days from the onset of symptoms. If destruction is considered necessary a dog should be shot through the heart.
- 8. Dogs which die or are destroyed from suspected Rabies should be decapitated and the head sent to the Pasteur Institute Kasauli, for examination and a report sent with it.
- 9. In cases where a dog dies or is destroyed on suspicion of having contracted Rabies, the human beings who have been in contact with, or have been bitten by the dog should be instructed to report to the Medical Officer for examination, and he will decide whether they should proceed to the Pastuer Institute, Kasauli, for Anti-Rabic treatment.

No. 850, RABIES—There have been some cases of Rabies recently in Sanawar. Several people are at this moment being inoculated after being bitten. Many people in Sanawar do not appear to understand the grave risk which rabies entails nor to understand how to act when the necessity arises.

- 1. Till further orders all dogs in Sanawar will either be muzzled or kept strictly on a leash. Any dog unmuzzled or found wandering about not on a leash is liable to be shot at sight.
- 2. Any dog who has not been registered in the Office and for whom a registration fee has not been paid and a disc issued is liable to be shot at sight. The registration fee is Rs. 2/-.
- 3. If a dog's behaviour causes anxiety it will be brought at once to the Hospital to the Medical Officer for orders on a leash. In no case will the dog be shot or otherwise destroyed till the Medical Officer has seen it. If it is absolutely necessary to shoot the dog at once the body must be sent as soon as possible to the Hospital.



General Qualifications.—A candidate for a commission from the must undergo a course of training of eighteen months' duration at the Military College, Sandhurst, and obtain a satisfactory report therefore courses commence in February and September each year.

Candidates for admission to the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, selected from those recommended by commanding officers on Army Form

(reprinted 1923).

To be eligible for recommendation a candidate must-

- (1) Be unmarried, and medically fit.
- (2) Be in possession of an Army First Class Certificate of Educati he is exempt from obtaining such a certificate.
- (3) Be at least an unpaid lance corporal, and have held that appropriate for six months prior to the 1st January or 1st July, as the be, of the year in which he is recommended.
- (4) Be under 23 years of age on 1st January for admission in the September, or 1st July for admission in the following Februa
- (5) Be a British subject and the son of British subjects, and European descent. In a doubtful case the burden of clear nationality or descent will rest upon the candidate, or, if he is upon his parents or guardians, and
- (6) Have at least 2 years' unexpired colour service or be prepared his service with the colours for such period as will leave his years' unexpired colour service as follows:—
  - (i) On the last April (for a candidate for a vacancy in the September) or
  - (ii) on the 1st September (for a candidate for a vacancy in the February).

Such extension must be earried out before joining the Royal Milital All such applications for extension of service should be submitted to the Secretary of State, The War Office, S. W. I., as early as possible.

- (a) has qualified for admission to the Royal Military Academy, Military College, or the Royal Air Force Cadet College; or
- (b) has been regarded—under section 32, paragraph 5 (ii) Educational Training, 1923—as though he possessed the Art Certificate.
