4. Members of the Staff are reminded that they should report sick at once and not wait, sometime for several days, until they can no longer carry on their duties, as has sometimes happened in the past. This practice very often results in a patient being absent from duty for several days longer than would have been necessary had the patient reported sick at once.

5. Those able to attend Hospital should do so at any convenient time between 9-30 and 13-00 hours.

6. Those unable to attend Hospital should report this fact to the Medical Officer in writing before 9-00 hrs, and he will visit them in their quarters.

"Members of the Staff" includes families of married members.

7. The visiting hours for hospital are from 17-00 to 18-30 hours only. No patient will be visited in hospital without the previous permission of the Nursing Sister or in her absence the senior Probationary Nurse-on-duty.

8. The special attention of every member of the Staff is called to the eye lists, which are published from time to time, especially the Teaching Staff. Reports will be made at once if any Wards on these lists are without Glasses, to the Medical Officer.

9. The Attending Orderly will march the boys required by the Medical Officer to the Hospital.

On the Medical Officer's arrival he will make the boys 'fall in', and they will not break ranks till dismissed by the Medical Officer.

The Attending Orderly will march the boys back to Barracks.

No boy will go to Hospital except under the Attending Orderly, unless he is sent by a member of the Staff owing to the urgency of the case.

10. A list will be kept by the Cooking Instructor or Matron in charge of kitchen, of all Wards on Extra Diet under them, and they will be directly responsible that Wards receive the Extra Diet. A complete list will also be kept by the Assistant Steward.

When Wards on Extra Diet are sent for by the Medical Officer for Examination they will be accompanied by their House Master or House Matron.

If Heads of Departments consider that any Ward would benefit by Extra Diet they should make their recommendation in writing to the Medical Officer.

No Ward will be put on or taken off the Extra Diet List unless their names have appeared in School Orders.

No Extra Diet foodstuffs will be drawn for Wards on long (Christmas) leave. The Extra Diet of a Ward on short leave or in Hospital may be drawn and used as the Head of the Department may think best.

11. Any Indian who appears to be ill or unfit should be made to report sick at once.

The Daily Sick report of Indians will be shown to all concerned in order that they may be acquainted with the sickness among the Indian personnel employed in their Departments.

8. The following orders about Camp are issued for information and guidance. They will be carefully explained to all boys by the Chief Instructor :

9. Camp will be approached only from the right-hand side of the stream (right-hand as one looks up the valley).

10. The path to Camp on the left-hand side of the stream will invariably be out of bounds,

11. The reason for this order is that there are standing crops on that side.

12. Boys will be warned on no account to interfere with waterways made by villagers for irrigating their lands and on no account to go near any standing crops, and to be careful never to do any damage, if they come across fields of crops on their rambles. Corn, Wheat and Maize are at all times valuable and especially at this time of dearth of food; carelessness in this direction is absolutely criminal and I hope that this rule will be faithfully and conscientiously kept.

13. All boys will return to Camp daily for their mid-day meal except those boys to whom the C. I. may give permission to be out all day. This leave must be asked for afresh every day and must be given with discretion. Roll Call at 6-30 p. m. daily.

14. Certain deep pools, which will be notified by the C. I., will be out of bounds for all boys except those who can swim. The C. I. will make a list of boys who may use these deep pools, and will read it out and add names to it from time to time if he thinks fit.

15. I expect the boy N. C. Os. to see to it that these rules are carried out both in the letter and in the spirit. They will see that all boys under their orders fully understand them.

16. All Indians' houses are out of bounds.

17. Sanitary arrangements must be scrupulously carried out.

18. If there is any misconduct in Camp, the Camp will be liable to be struck at a moment's notice, and an immediate return made to Sanawar.

Craigwell House, April 22nd, 1929.**

The message of the King-Emperor to his people after his illness is published for information.

"In looking back on my long illness and recovery my heart is full of thankfulness of far deeper origin than any mere sense of relief.

I have been brought back from the danger and weariness of the past months by the wonderful skill and devotion of my Doctors, Surgeons and Nurses. And help has come from another source of strength: as month after month went by I learned of the wide-spread and loving solicitude with which the Queen and I were surrounded. I was able to picture to myself the crowds of friends waiting and watching at my gates, and to think of the still greater number of those who, in every part of the Empire, were remembering me with prayers and good wishes. The realization of this has been among the most vivid experiences of my life.

It was an encouragement beyond description to feel that my constant and earnest desire had been granted—the desire to gain the confidence and affection of my People. My thoughts have carried me even farther than this. I cannot dwell upon the generous sympathy shown to me by unknown friends in many other countries without a new and moving hope. I long to believe it possible that experiences such as mine may soon appear no longer exceptional: when the national anxieties of all the Peoples of the World shall be felt as a common source of human sympathy and a common claim on human friendship.

I am not yet able to bear the strain of a public ceremony, but I look forward on some appointed day to joining with my People at home and overseas in thanking Almighty God, not merely for my own recovery, but for the new evidences of a growing kindness significant of the true nature of Men and Nations.

In the meantime I hope that this message may reach all those, even in the remotest corners of the world, from whom I have received words of sympathy and good will."

This is largely because of the carelessness of Wards who throw about paper, old fruit-skins, monkey nut shells and any refuse and have no care for the cleanliness or look of their Departments and their surroundings.

Additional refuse bins have now been put up and I must order this matter to be taken up promptly and keenly.

Officials in charge of Departments will see that their Sweepers do their work better than it is being done at present. Wards are warned that, unless an improvement is shown in these matters, and that immediately, the Tuck Shops will be closed and the vendors prevented from coming to barracks.

The Head Master, the Head Mistress and the Head Mistress of the Preparatory School will submit to me weekly reports in this connection from their Schools.

"The lot is fallen unto me in a fair ground, yea, I have a goodly heritage," so wrote a poet once. People who turn goodly heritages into pig-styes must be suitably dealt with. 1—The Swimming Bath is out of bounds at all times except when permission to use the bath has first been obtained from the Chief Instructor.

2—Ordinary Swimming Classes will be by sets.

3—A member of the Staff must ordinarily always be on duty when the bath is being used—except for boys in Class A.

4—A certain number of really good swimmers will be put into Class A (names will be posted up on the School Notice Board) and these may use the tank at any time without supervision, provided:—

(a) They get leave from the Chief Instructor.

(b) That not less than 4 in all are present.

(c) That they prevent any who are not in Class "A" from using the tank on these occasions.

(d) This privilege is not to be exercised when small boys are in the bath.

5—At other times *e. g.* Wednesday and Saturday afternoons, all boys who have passed a test of swimming two Lengths, may use the bath provided:—

(a) They obtain the permission of the Chief Instructor.

(b) That no boy stays in the water or undressed more than 20 minutes.

(c) One member of the Military Staff has been detailed to supervise.

6—Any member of the Staff or School at the bath shall automatically be considered to be in charge according to seniority.

7—Boys forbidden on medical grounds will not use the bath—until this restriction has been removed by the Medical Officer.

8—When a member of the Military Staff is not available a Prefect and a senior boy (provided they are both good swimmers) will at the discretion of the Chief Instructor be detailed to supervise. At such times, the Sergt. on duty must be in the vicinity of the bath to receive reports and make occasional visits.

9—The Chief Instructor will arrange for the Lower and Upper Schools to use the bath at separate periods.

10—Boys are asked to exercise care in keeping the bath clean.

The habit of throwing stones etc. and going in with dirty feet must stop.

11—Any irregularities in these rules must be reported by the senior person present and any infringement of these orders will be severely dealt with.

No. 731, SCHOOLS—The Athletic Season will begin officially on Monday, September 16th but as the grounds will be marked out fully for all events on Monday 9th, those training for Founder's Week Sports will be able to devote a considerable amount of time to training during holiday week.

No. 732, SCHOOLS—The Football Season is now in abeyance till after Founder's Week. The necessary equipment for all events to be indented for.

Wimbledon will be of course kept open as there is the final coaching and selecting of the Tennis VI to meet Auckland House in October to be undertaken.

(1) In the Field Events the 4 competitors will be left in for the Finals who have put up the best performances (3 tries each being allowed).

5. Coolis for Staff will not be available on the 12th instant. Any heavy baggage for Dharampore may be sent on the carts with the Wards' luggage.

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS—ORDERS FOR WARDS—

1. A special train will leave Dharampore at 15-00 hours on the 12th December. Only Wards whose parents actually come up and fetch them will be allowed to go before 11-30 hours.
