2. The Medical Officer will see all sick members of the Staff and they will be "put on" the Sick List, and after recovery "taken off" the Sick List. Both these entries will be published in Orders.

3. A patient once put on the Sick List will on no account leave his or her quarters until his or her name appears in orders as having been taken off the Sick List, except to take convalescent exercise, with the Medical Officer's permission.

4. Members of the Staff are reminded that they should report sick at once and not wait, sometime for several days, until they can no longer carry on their duties, as has sometimes happened in the past. This practice very often results in a patient being absent from duty for several days longer than would have been necessary had the patient reported sick at once.

5. Those able to attend Hospital should do so at any convenient time between 9-30 and 13-00 hours.

6. Those unable to attend Hospital should report this fact to the Medical Officer in writing before 9-00 hrs, and he will visit them in their quarters.

"Members of the Staff" includes families of married members.

7. The visiting hours for hospital are from 17-00 to 18-30 hours only. No patient will be visited in hospital without the previous permission of the Nursing Sister or in her absence the senior Probationary Nurse-on-duty.

8. The special attention of every member of the Staff is called to the eye lists, which are published from time to time, especially the Teaching Staff. Reports will be made at once if any Wards on these lists are without Glasses, to the Medical Officer.

9. The Attending Orderly will march the boys required by the Medical Officer to the Hospital.

On the Medical Officer's arrival he will make the boys 'fall in', and they will not break ranks till dismissed by the Medical Officer.

The Attending Orderly will march the boys back to Barracks.

No boy will go to Hospital except under the Attending Orderly, unless he is sent by a member of the Staff owing to the urgency of the case.

10. A list will be kept by the Cooking Instructor or Matron in charge of kitchen, of all Wards on Extra Diet under them, and they will be directly responsible that Wards receive the Extra Diet. A complete list will also be kept by the Assistant Steward.

When Wards on Extra Diet are sent for by the Medical Officer for Examination they will be accompanied by their House Master or House Matron.

If Heads of Departments consider that any Ward would benefit by Extra Diet they should make their recommendation in writing to the Medical Officer.

No Ward will be put on or taken off the Extra Diet List unless their names have appeared in School Orders.

No Extra Diet foodstuffs will be drawn for Wards on long (Christmas) leave. The Extra Diet of a Ward on short leave or in Hospital may be drawn and used as the Head of the Department may think best.

The Daily Sick report of Indians will be shown to all concerned in order that they may be acquainted with the sickness among the Indian personnel employed in their Departments.

5. C.S.M. Hawkes and Sgt. Caswell, will proceed to Camp on Sunday afternoon, April 27th. with an advance party, 6 in number. Baggage will leave at 10-00 hours.

6. The camp will be laid out and tents pitched under the orders of the Chief Instructor.

7. Boys who have been in Hospital and have been discharged after April 18th will not go to Camp unless they obtain leave from the Medical Officer.

8. The following orders about Camp are issued for information and guidance. They will be carefully explained to all boys by the Chief Instructor:

9. Camp will be approached only from the right-hand side of the stream (right-hand as one looks up the valley).

10. The path to Camp on the left-hand side of the stream will invariably be out of bounds.

11. The reason for this order is that there are standing crops on that side.

12. Boys will be warned on no account to interfere with waterways made by villagers for irrigating their lands and on no account to go near any standing crops, and to be careful never to do any damage, if they come across fields of crops on their rambles. Corn, Wheat and Maize are at all times valuable and especially at this time of dearth of food; carelessness in this direction is absolutely criminal and I hope that this rule will be faithfully and conscientiously kept. The attitude of Sir Henry Lawrence, Our Founder, towards Indians should be faithfully preserved.

13. All boys will return to Camp daily for their mid-day meal except those boys to whom the C. I. may give permission to be out all day. This leave must be asked for afresh every day and must be given with discretion. Roll Call at 6-30 p. m. daily.

14. Certain deep pools, which will be notified by the C. I., will be out of bounds for all boys except those who can swim. The C. I. will make a list of boys who may use these deep pools, and will read it out and add names to it from time to time if he thinks fit.

15. All Indians' houses are out of bounds.

16. Sanitary arrangements must be scrupulously carried out.

17. If there is any misconduct in Camp, the Camp will be liable to be struck at a moment's notice, and an immediate return made to Sanawar.

18. The G. D. will make adequate arrangements for feeding Havelock House during Camp period. Food to be sent to B. K. in Fuelless Cookers.

19. I expect the boy N. C. Os. to see to it that these rules are carried out both in the letter and in the spirit. They will see that all boys under their orders fully understand them.

8. Passes should not be given by the Head Master or Head Mistress without the Chief Instructor, Head Matron or Head Matron P. D., being informed, and then only in consultation with them. For various reasons Passes may not be desirable.

9. All the passes referred to up to this point in this order (except Office Pass for sleeping out of Sanawar) will be called *Major Passes*. Major Pass Book may be obtained from the office by Heads of Departments.

10. *Minor Passes* for Sanawar (when not standing passes) and for anywhere in the neighbourhood (Kasauli, Dagshai, etc.) which do not entail sleeping out may be given direct by the Chief Instructor, Head Matron, Head Matron P. D. These Minor Pass Books may be obtained from the Office. These Minor Passes may not be given if the question of work in school hours is affected. NOTICE—GARDEN NOTE—This is the time to cut down perennial carnations to within an inch or two of the ground, if profuse flowering is looked for in the spring and early summer. It is also the best time to take cuttings. Many cuttings can be made from one long stem. The length of cutting I have found most practicable is about 3 inches long. Small boxes should be used for these cuttings, which can be planted close together. Some sand in the soil is necessary to aid drainage.

The soil in the box should be kept damp but not too damp or the cuttings will damp off. This is why it is not desirable to take cuttings (including Geranium cuttings) in the middle of the monsoon.

Chrysanthemums are notoriously dirty feeders and at this time the plants should be given plenty of manure, ichthemic guano, or blood.

ROSES—I have found from experience that the best time to do the annual severe pruning of rose trees is at the end of February.

1. Founder's Week will be from October 6th to 12th, with Founder's Day on the second Thursday in October as usual (October 9th.)

H. E. Field Marshal Sir William R. Birdwood, Bart, G.C.B. G.C.M.G., G.C.S.I., C.I.E., D.S.O., C-in-C. in India will preside.

2. In view of training for athletics and competing in Founder's Week Sports the following points are brought to the attention of those concerned.

3. The Athletic Season will begin officially on Monday, September 15th but as the ground will be marked out fully for all events on Monday 8th those training for Founder's Week Sports will be able to devote a considerable amount of time to training during holiday week.

4. The Football Season is now in abeyance till after Founder's Week The Boys' School will devote its games' periods to practising for the sports, and running in regularly organised Hodson packs. The running Track will be marked out. The necessary equipment for all events to be indented for.

5. This training period should be systematically carried out and boys really coached in the principles of short and long distance running, jumping, hurdling putting-the-shot, throwing-the-cricket-ball, etc. Eliminating heats will be run off during the week beginning September 22nd and names of all finalists for Founder's Week submitted for printing not later than Saturday, September 27th if possible.

6. These orders also apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Girls' School. The Lacrosse Goal Posts may remain and the game played as the Head Mistress may think fit.

7. For coaching in athletics advice and assistance should be sought from those qualified to give it on the Boys' School Staff.

8. Wimbledon will be of course kept open as there is the final coaching and selecting of the Tennis VI to meet Auckland House in October to be undertaken.

9. The following procedure will be adopted with reference to the eliminating heats for the sports:—

10 In the Field Events the 4 competitors will be left in for the Finals who have put up the best performances (3 tries each being allowed.)

11 In the track events and hurdles. The names of all competitors will be put into a hat. They will be drawn five at a time on the ground and the competitors will first run in heats of these 5. The names of the first three in each heat will be taken. The surviving names will from the next unit to be dealt with, either on the same day or, if possible, on another day. The names will again be drawn in fives and heats run off, the first three names being taken. This process will be continued till it is possible to get down to two heats when 4 names (the first two in each heat) only will remain in for all races up to an including the 440. (For the girls' 440 eight names will be left in.) For the 880 and 1 mile 8 names will be left in. If numbers are not an exact multiple of 5, some of the heats may contain more than 5 Two examples are given in *illustration*:—

12 To insure the proper number of competitors actually appearing in all Finals on the day of the Sports one reserve name for each event will be taken and printed on the programme. This will cover possible emergent casualties. Every event *must* have its proper number of starters.

13 As the Athletic Meetings have now been established for some time and records are none too easy to beat, all record breakers will score 5 points if the "R" flag is hoisted on their behalf. These points will count for Cock House and for the Athletic Medal in both Schools. They will also count in the Hodsons. If the second or third (or any place) competitor breaks the record, points will be scored both for Cock House and the Athletic Medal.

14 The same will also apply in the Aquatic Sports.

15 In future, as the Relay Race in the Sports is a combined effort representing many runners, it will score 20, 10, and 5 points for Houses for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. This will also apply to the Aquatic Sports.

16 The starting and finishing point for relay races should be midway in the straight. Stations for teams will be drawn for and retained throughout the race.

Lines, parallel to the side of the track, should be drawn to denote stations, also lines 10 yards on each side of, and parallel to, the starting lines. Failure to exchange between these lines, disqualifies the team.

NOTES.—(a) It is imperative that a baton be exchanged. (b) The Rule with reference to fouling, or impeding a runner also applies to Relay Races.

17 Boys and Girls are allowed to mix in Founder's Week at the undermentioned events, under the following conditions:—

(1) That Boys and Girls take an intelligent and sustained interest in what is going on.

(2) That they "play the game".

(3) That the officials in charge of the boys and girls are responsible for their behaviour and deal with any who behave badly.

No. 926, GARDEN NOTE—Some gardeners are asking what to do with their chrysanthemums. When flowering has finished the long stems should be cut right off as near the bottom as possible. The young plants growing round the old stem should be watered (but not overwatered). Pots should be left out in the cold. Chrysanthemums are hardy plants and snow and frost does them good. By the end of February the young plants should be ready to be separated and replanted. If long plants are required and small flowers the small plants should be put in with the young root. If larger blooms are required the roots should be cut off and the cuttings put in about three inches long. These should be kept well watered till they have taken when a strong and vigorous plant should be the result of slow and steady growth during the summer and monsoon.

No. 927, SCHOOL—In future the Signalling Class will use Standard II Class Room for their evening work.

No. 928, EXAMINATIONS—There have been too many failures recently in examinations connected with the University of London and the Cambridge Local Examinations.

The Head Master and Head Mistress will be very careful in future when submitting lists to me that no names of candidates not likely to pass are sent in and that only the names of those candidates whose work and attitude to work justify their selection are included in the final list.

Candidates working for the London University Examinations are reminded that they are enjoying a unique privilege. Sanawar is the only centre in India where the London Examinations can be taken. INDIA ARMY ORDER

No. 938.—I. A. O. 699—COMPLIMENTARY—

My tenure as Commander-in-Chief in India being about to terminate, I desire to place on record my high appreciation of the excellent work which has been carried out by those serving under me during the time it has been my privilege to hold the appointment. The period has been one in which much re-organization has taken place and in which considerable changes have been made in our military system; the successful initiation of these new measures is in itself a striking testimony to the great and sustained effort made by all concerned, and I am most grateful to all ranks for their constant and un-failing support and for the loyal and wholehearted manner in which they have striven to give effect to my wishes.

During my period of command, and especially during the last year, many calls have been made on the troops, both British and Indian, to assist in the preservation of internal order, and the restraint, self-control, good humour and sense of humanity displayed in carrying out this task—the most unpleasant of all those that fall to a soldier—has evoked my unbounded admiration.

As an officer of the Indian Army I particularly wish to place on record my pride and gratification at the steadfast and loyal behaviour of my Indian comrades in face of determined efforts made, both in cantonments and in their own homes, to seduce them from their allegiance to their Sovereign.

It will be realised with what great regret it now falls to me to bid farewell to the Army in India with which I have been associated for over 45 years but I do so with pride in the knowledge of its efficiency, zeal and fine spirit and with complete confidence in its future.

I trust that many years of success, happiness and good health may be before all my comrades of the Army in India.

1. All members of the Staff leaving Sanawar for the holidays will leave their addresses in my Office. It is essential that I should know the addresses of all members of the Staff in case it is necessary to correspond with them. An address book will be prepared in the Office.

2. Keys of quarters are to be handed in at my Office. Keys should be labelled with owner's name.

3. The quarters are to be left in such a state that it may be possible to whitewash the walls, carry out necessary repairs to floors, fire-places, walls and windows.

4. All furniture in quarters will be checked by the occupant and left so as to be checked officially afterwards.

5. Coolies for Staff will not be available on the 18th instant. Any heavy baggage for Dharampore may be sent on the carts with the Wards' luggage.

No. 950, CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS—ORDERS FOR WARDS

1. A special train will leave Dharampore at 17-26 hours on the 18th December. Only Wards whose parents actually come up and fetch them will be allowed to go before 11-30 hours.

Buns and Cocoa will be provided in kitchens between 11-30—12-30 hours for all children. Hot dinner will be provided for those staying in Sanawar at 18-30 hours on the 18th December.

2. No Ward who is in Hospital on Thursday morning will be allowed to go home without a written leave from the Medical Officer, "Discharged fit to travel." This leave to be written on the ordinary discharge certificate Post Card.

3. Luggage belonging to Wards going away will be collected at one end of the verandah of every "House." The boxes will be labelled with the Ward's name on a special label which will be issued to Departments. This luggage to be ready by 8-00 hours on Thursday morning and the boxes so arranged that all the labels show in the same direction on the small side (end) of the box. All labelled boxes will be collected by School coolies, brought to the Lawrence Club and will be transported in carts to Dharampore. Boxes thus transported will be found at Kalka.

4. All Wards, except those going to Simla by the morning train, (09-31 hours from Dharampore) will attend Chapel in the morning at the usual time, 09-00 hours. This will be a Parade Service for the Boys' School, with Colours and Band.

5. Baggage for Simla Wards to be put ready labelled in the verandahs of Houses by 17-00 hours on Wednesday. It will be collected as soon after 17-00 hours as possible, brought to the Stores watched at night and sent by the School coolies early in the morning to Dharampore.

6. Pocket money balances for Wards going home will be sent to Departments on Tuesday the 16th December. The money will be paid out on Thursday, and the books will be returned to Office.

Wards leaving for good, will be sent to my Office on Tuesday—Boys—11-30—12-30 hours. Girls—between 13-00 and 14-00 hours. Travelling money will be sent to Departments on Wednesday.

7. No Government bedding or clothing of any description, including boots, may be taken away from Sanawar, unless a written order is issued from the Principal.

8. All Wards must be made to understand quite distinctly that they must not leave Sanawar, whether they are leaving for the holidays only or for good, without a written pass issued by me. Passes will be made out in my Office for Departments separately.

9. House Masters and Matrons will see that Wards are thoroughly clean before they go home.

10. No Wards will be allowed to travel by Car from Sanawar to Kalka or from Sanawar to Dharampore unless they are in possession of a yellow Pass signed by me. This Pass will only be issued if parents or guardians write to me giving the necessary permission. All cars will be stopped at the top of Tilley's slope before leaving Sanawar and the occupants examined as to whether they have in their possession the necessary yellow Car Slip. This slip signed by me will interpret the wishes of parents.

11. **B. D.**—All Wards going on leave will personally hand in all Government property in their possession to House Masters who will check it and, if correct, will give every boy a slip (called C. S. or Check Slip) which will be presented to the Chief Instructor by whom only Leave Passes issued by the Principal will be given out to Wards.

If any Government property is lost such losses will be stated on the Check Slip by the House Master and the price will be either recovered by the Chief Instructor from the Ward before the pass is issued or, if no money is available, *and only in this case*, the pass may be issued and the Check Slip sent to my Office in order that the recovery may be made in the usual way through the monthly bills.

12. In the **G. D.** and **P. D.**—The same arrangements will be in force except that the House Matrons will take the place of House Masters and the Head Matrons that of the Chief Instructor.

13. Wards will not go to Dharampore on December 18th under any circumstances to change their clothes.

14. No passes will be issued till Government clothes are handed in. Officials who actually hand leave passes to Wards will see that the Railway Slip and "Free from contact with Infectious Disease Certificate" (F.C.I.D.) are attached. Without the latter (duly signed by parents or guardians) Wards will not be received next term.

15. On arrival at Kalka no Ward will be allowed on to the main platform of the station till he (or she) has in his (or her) hand a slip indicating by what train he (or she) will continue the journey.

These slips will be of three colours *Salmon, Green and Blue* and will be issued from my Office attached to the passes. The salmon slip will be given to Wards travelling by the N. W. Ry. and O. & R.
