Standing Orders for L. R. M. S.

MEDICAL.

(A) HOSPITAL.

The normal working hours of the hospital will be from 09-15 hours to 13-00 hours, except on Sundays. (Holidays 10-00 hours till 12-00 hours).

1. Duties of Resident Medical Officer.

- (a) Hospital-(1) Supervision and administration.
 - (2) Care of equipment and stores.
 - (3) Thorough medical examination of all new Wards,
- (b) Hygiene (1) In all matters of hygiene (including Clothing, Dietary Scales, Extra Diet and Conservancy) the Medical Officer acts in an advisory capacity to the Principal. He will maintain a Sanitary Diary.
 - (2) Vaccination and preventive Inoculations.
 - (3) Anthropometrical Measurements.
 - (4) He will maintain a register of Wards requiring special medical observation, with notes on each case for the guidance of his successor.
 - (5) He will carry out a Dental Survey and Foot Inspection once a term.
 - (6) He will keep in touch with the Chief Instructor and Head Matrons, and inspect their Sanitary Books weekly.
 - (7) He will maintain reciprocal liaision with the Senior Medical Officers of Kasauli, Dagshai and Solan, with regard to epidemics.
 - (8) He will lecture to the Hygiene Class when his other duties permit.
- (c) Medical Attendance—He is responsible that all classes receive medical attention, and will maintain a Treatment Register for all European Staff and their families, to serve as a guide to his successor.
- (d) Vice-Principal—He will act for the Principal during his absence or illness.

2. Duties of Sub-charge.

- (a) Maintenance of Records and routine office work.
- (b) Charge of Stores in Dispensary and Medical Store.
- (c) Treatment of Indian personnel (09-15 to 10-00 hours daily) and of such European personnel as come to him for minor diseases.
- (d) Inspection of rations 5 days a week and of Food handlers, Barbers and Dhobies on the first Monday in each month.

3. Duties of Nursing Sister.

- (a) Cleanliness, Treatment and Discipline in the Wards.
- (b) Training and Welfare of the Probationary Nurses including supervision of their Clothing.
- (c) Charge of Bed-stock and of Ward and Theatre equipment.
- (d) In her absence, the Probationer on duty will act for her.

4. Duties of the Hospital Kitchen Matron.

- (a) Her hours of duty are from 07-00 to 13-00 hours.
- (b) Cleanliness and care of all stock in the Kitchen.
- (c) The preparation of the food of Patients and Nurses.
- (d) She will receive rations and report deficiencies to the Nursing Sister.

5. Ward Routine.

- (a) Visiting hours 16-30 to 17-30 hours. Visitors will not enter the Wards without the knowledge of the Nursing Sister.
- (b) Discharges will take place daily at 08-90 hours except on Sundays.
- (c) Admissions and discharges will be noted on the Sick Report, and the latter taken to the Head Master and Chief Instructor daily at 11-30 hours by the B. D. out-patient orderly.

6. Appointment of Probationary Nurses.

When vacancies occur at L. R. M. S. hospital for Probationary Nurses, applications will be called for in School Orders. Candidates will submit their applications to the Principal through the Head Mistress of the Girls' Department, together with

sanction of parent or guardian. Normally, selected candidates will join in February and stay until the autumn of the following year. The Selection Committee will consist of the Principal, the Medical Officer, the Head Mistress of the Girls' Department, and the Nursing Sister.

7. Treatment of Staff.

It is here pointed out that the L. R. M. S. Hospital is built and equipped for children, and staffed from the Girls' School, so that only Wards can be given in-patient treatment. As regards Dental Treatment, the visiting dentist is usually prepared to give appointments to non-entitled members of the Staff, but these must never take place in times allotted to Wards.

The Medical Officer will see all sick members of the Staff and they will be "put on" the Sick List, and on recovery "taken off" the Sick List. Both these entries will be published in Orders.

A patient once put on the Sick List will on no account leave his or her quarters until his or her name appears in orders as having been taken off the Sick List, except to take convalescent exercise, with the Medical Officer's permission.

Those able to attend Hospital should do so between 10-00 and 13-00 hours by appointment only.

Those unable to attend Hospital should report to the Medical Officer in writing before 9-00 hours, and he will visit them in their quarters.

Members of the Staff, or their wives, wishing to see the Nursing Sister should attend after hospital hours, unless by appointment.

Dispensing hours are from 09-30 to 11-00 hours: all medicines dispensed will be sanctioned by the Medical Officer.

8. Treatment of Wards.

Morning Sick Parades will be held at 08-15 hours except on Sundays and holidays, when they will be at 09-30 hours. The B. D. will be seen by the Sub-Assistant Surgeon on the B. D. pavement, the G. D. and P. D. by the Nursing Sister at the Girls' Ward.

The out-patient orderlies who will be appointed by the Head Master and Head Mistress will be responsible for the discipline and escorting of out-patients. The B. D. orderly will invariably be an N. C. O. No Ward may ordinarily go to Hospital except with an orderly.

9. The Duties of the Sanitary Sergeant.

He will be directly responsible to the Medical Officer for all Conservancy matters and measures of hygiene, including entire control of all sweepers, efficiency of incinerators, supervision of Bakery, Dairy and Slaughter-house at hours laid down by the Medical Officer, shooting of unauthorized dogs and pigs, and the submission on the first of each month of a statement shewing the occupancy in detail of Government servants' quarters.

He will be directly responsible to the Principal for the work of all school coolies outside stores, maintaining necessary records, and he will report to the Principal matters of importance regarding the Estate. He will supervise the Gardens and Warriors' Grove.

10. Food-handlers, Barbers and Dhobies.

Employees of Contractors and Messes and School Barbers will be medically inspected between 10-00 and 12-00 hours on the first Monday in every month. Nominal Rolls will be submitted when called for by the Medical Officer. Contractors will inform the latter when any of their employees is sick or unaccountably absent, or when wishing to engage a new employee. All the above personnel will be in possession of a pass.

11. Sweepers.

Only the following will employ School Sweepers:-

Matrons.

Nursing Sister.

Those living in Departments will employ only sweepers working in the Department. The Chief Instructor and Head Matrons will be responsible for the distribution of this work and ensure that the School work does not suffer.

The Matrons and Nursing Sister will only employ sweepers for actual sweepers' work—they will not employ them for water-carrying, wood-chopping, messages, or looking after animals etc.

The names of the wet sweepers will be published in orders, and no alteration in this list will be made without reference to the Medical Officer, whose sanction is required for leave granted to sweepers. The discharge and engagement of sweepers will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of the Medical Officer.

12. Accommodation of Friends etc.

No European or Indian may accommodate friends or relations in their quarters other than those directly dependent on them, without first obtaining the written permission of the Principal, and of the Medical Officer.

13. Hawkers.

Hawkers desiring to trade in Sanawar will apply to the Chief Clerk for a pass from, which, when signed by the Medical Officer and countersigned by the Principal, will be available for a year from the date of issue.

All hawkers will pay a deposit of Rs. 5/- on receipt of a pass, this sum to be forfeited in the event of any misdemeanour on their part.

The names of all authorised Hawkers, with the Departments in which they are allowed to trade, will be published in orders.

Hawkers are on no account allowed in barracks. Any Hawker found in barracks will be handed over to the Chief Clerk.

14. Dogs.

Dog Licenses will be issued from the Office at Rs. 5/- per annum, on condition that owners accept without demur any measures which may at any time be recommended by the Medical Officer. They will be required to sign a declaration to this effect before the License is issued.

Dog-owners will not habitually allow their dogs to roam unattended over the School area.

15. Other Live-Stock.

No chickens nor ducks, nor any other kind of poultry, nor cows, will be kept within 100 yards of any barrack. Any pigs found in the School area will be shot; they should be permanently penned outside the boundary.

16. Weighing and Measuring.

The whole school will attend for weighing and measuring twice a year. This will be done by classes, the Headmaster and Headmistresses arranging the order in which they attend. The Masters and Mistresses will be present with their classes and will enter the details in the register, noting the figures in pounds and inches, and bearing in mind the great importance of legibility and accuracy in their records.

The Sub-Assistant-Surgeon will deal with the B. D., and the Nursing Sister the G. D. and P. D.

Members of the Staff wishing to be weighed, are asked to subscribe two annas each time to the Dai Fund.

N. B. If any boy in special training for boxing loses more than three pounds in weight, this fact will be reported to the M. O.

17. Goitre List.

The names of Wards on the Goitre List will be published from time to time in Orders. These wards will report for inspection at the hospital at 11-30 hours on the first week-day in each month. The Head Matron, G. D., will be responsible that the treatment laid down for those in G. D. is carried out, and the B. D. outpatient orderly will ensure that all boys on the Goitre List take their iodine in the B. K. daily.

18. Inoculation.

Wards who have been inoculated will go to bed immediately, and will be excused all violent exercise for two clear days thereafter. If feeling unwell they will at once report to the Chief Instructor or Head Matron as the case may be.

19. Diet.

- (a) The Dietary Scales will be strictly adhered to.
- (b) The Medical Officer will satisfy himself from time that the menus provided for Probationary Nurses and P. D Orderlies are suitable.
- (e) The names of those on Extra Diet will be published in Orders. The Cook-Sergeant and Kitchen-Matrons will ensure that those on Extra Diet receive it. Examination candidates will receive Extra Diet at the discretion of the M. O.

- (f) The "Tuck" arrangements will be under the control of the Chief Instructor and Head Matrons. No cooked foods (curry, pilau, etc.) may be sold to wards between noon and 1830 hours.
- (g) Parents may give their children any food they desire, but such food will only be eaten at the "Tea" meal.

 Uncooked fruit may be eaten at any meal.

20. Sanitary Sergeant.

- (a) He will maintain a Sanitary Note-book, to be submitted to the M. O. every Saturday. In this will be entered an account of his rounds. He will note all entries in the Sanitary Diary.
- (b) As regards Departments, the Sanitary Sergeant will have entire control of the sweepers ailotted to the latrines, and will be held responsible for the efficiency of their work both in latrines and night rooms. In this connection, the intelligent and willing co-operation of all members of the Staff (especially House Masters and Matrons) with the Sanitary Sergeant, is essential. Only so can the difficult task of ensuring an efficient conservancy system be fulfilled. Complaints in regard to Departmental sweepers will be made to the Sanitary Sergeant.
- (c) As regards the Indian latrines, he will constantly bear in mind that epidemics of enteric and dysentery are only likely to arise through failure of the Sanitary personnel, and that these diseases are almost invariably spread by flies passing from faeces (of enteric or dysentery patients) to food.
- In this connection he will make it his business to prevent promiscuous excretion, and to ensure that all Indian latrine pans are clean at least at the following times:—06-00, 08-00, 09-00, 12-00, 16-00 and 18-00 hours.

(a) H_{EAD} D_{RESS} :— G_{URKHA} H_{AT} .

as under :-

The hat will be worn evenly on the head. On no account will be centre of the hat be stitched. The chin-strap will be polished to a dark brown colour, and worn on the point of the chin. The brass buckle will also be polished. The buckle will be worn on the left side. The top edge of the buckle to be two inches from the bottom of the hook on the helmet. The strap, so that it can be worn on the point of the chin, will be adjusted by punching a hole in the longer portion of the strap for the hook on the right side of the hat. The portion of strap between this hole and the end will not be cut off. The spare end of the shorter strap below the buckle will be cut off so that the point is $\frac{1}{2}$ inch below the longer edge of the buckle. Unless otherwise ordered the hat will not be worn after 5 p.m.

(b) HOSETOPS, PUTTEES AND RED FLASH.

The method of wearing hosetops, puttees and red flash will be

The puttees will be one-third of the Regulation length i.e. 37 inches long. The tape will be 36 inches long.

The hosetops will be supplied with an elastic band to fit underneath the instep.

The flash will be of red material made in two pieces attached to an elastic garter.

Instruction for Wearing.

The puttee will be wound evenly round the ankle about 3 or 4 folds. The pointed end of the puttee to finish at side of ankle on outer flank. The tape to be wound evenly round about three times, and any surplus length of tape to be tucked behind the pointed end of puttee.

The hosetop to be evenly folded down at the top to a depth not exceeding $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches and the foot placed inside the elastic band provided for the purpose.

The flash will be 4 inches in length, 2 inches wide; one flash being $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches shorter than the other. The flash will be sewn on an elastic band, and the triangles hemmed to prevent fraying.

The flash will be worn one inch outside of shin bone. The length of flash to show under turn-over of hosetops from $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 inches according to length of leg.

(c) RIFLES AND BAYONET SCABBARDS.

All adjustments and cleaning will be carried out in the Armoury. Under no circumstances will Wards interfere with weapons issued to them for drill or training purposes.

MEDALS. METHOD OF WEARING-OTHER RANKS.

Worn on the left breast. They are to be worn in a horizontal line suspended from a single bar, which is not to be sewn or stitched to the jacket, and placed midway between the first and second buttons. The edge of the first ribbon will be 11 inches from the edge of the jacket.

The ribbon will be 1 inch in length unless the possession of clasps requires it to be longer. In any case, the base of the medals will be in line.

In Khaki Drill. Worn on a bar in the same position as prescribed for medals above.

In Service Dress. Sewn on the jacket in the same position as prescribed above.

Width of the ribbon in both cases to be 1 inch.

Medal ribbons are to be frequently renewed. Worn and dirty ribbons are not to be worn.

CHEVRON.

May be worn on khaki drill clothing either sewn on their jackets or attached by hooks and eyes.

Regulation Pattern Boots as issued from the Quartermaster's Stores will be worn. The only exception to the order is when in possession of the Medical Officer's certificate certifying that the Regulation pattern boots cannot be worn.

(h) EPAULETTES AND DRESSCORDS.
Bandsmen, Buglers and Drummers will wear Epaulettes, and in addition Buglers and Drummers will wear Dresscords as follows:—

- On all Ceremonial Parades.
- (b) When walking out of Barracks, except that Epaulettes will not be worn during inclement weather.

MOURNING BAND.

When attending Military funerals or memorial services connected therewith, Officers and Warrant Officers will wear a mourning band of black crepe, 34 inches wide, round the left arm above the elbow. It will not be worn at ceremonies such as the unveiling of memorials and Armistice Day celebrations.

Warrant Officers, in private mourning may, when in uniform, wear a mourning band as described above. A N. C. O. or man may similarly, whether in private mourning or at a military funeral, wear a mourning band of black material should he wish to do so.

"71(a) Unless in any particular case it be otherwise distinctly provided, the whole time of a public officer must be held to be paid for by the State, and he may be employed in any manner required by proper authority within his own branch of duty, without claim for additional remuneration, whether the services rendered are such as would ordinarily be paid for from General Revenues or a Local Fund or from the revenues of an Indian State."

For the purpose of this Article, the Principal is the proper authority and, in cases of doubt, he is also the authority to decide what constitutes a Government employee's own branch of duty.

The term "remuneration" includes remuneration in any form i.e. payment in cash or reduction in working hours on any particular day as compensation for work within an employee's own branch of duty which it may be necessary for the individual to undertake outside his "normal" working hours.
