No. 18, ARMS LICENSES—Letter No. 6480-A-H/1306 (H. Police) dated 12th January, 1937 from the Home Scoretary to the Government of the Punjab is published below for information:—

Government are of opinion that in future no license for the possession of arms for the purpose of sport should be granted/or renewed unless the District Magistrate is satisfied that the applicant or holder (as the case may be) has taken out, or intends to take out, a shooting license under the Punjab Wild Birds and Wild Animals Protection Act, 1933. I am directed to ask you to advise all the District Magistrates in your division accordingly.

2. These instructions will not affect arms licenses granted for the purpose of protection and/or display, as distinct from sport. It is intended that all such licenses should be renewed as before, at the discretion of the District Magistrates. Other cases will also come up in which licenses have been given for the purpose of sport combined with protection and/or display, and in some of these the applicants will perhaps be unable to satisfy the District Magistrate that they have taken out or intend to take out licenses under the Act of 1933. In these cases it will be for the District Magistrate to consider whether the license was granted primarily for the purpose of sport or for one of the other purposes. If he comes to the conclusion that the license has been held primarily for the purpose of sport, Government consider that he would be justified in refusing renewal altogether unless the applicant showed himself willing to take out a shooting license. On the other hand if the license had been given primarily for protection or display, it would be better in a case of this kind for the District Magistrate to renew, deleting the word "sport" from the license.

ARMY INSTRUCTIONS (INDIA) No. 116, of 1936.

Leave Rules for civilian personnel (new entrants) employed with the various departments of the Army.

(Approved by the Secretary of State.)

With effect from the 31st July 1935, the following leave rules will apply to the civilian personnel specified in Army Instruction (India), No. 47 of 1935. The other leave rules in the Civil Service Regulations shall remain operative in the case of these personnel, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with or repugnant in subject or context to these rules:—

Rules.

- 1. These Rules may be called the Revised Leave Rules for Civilians.
- 2. These rules shall apply to the following classes of persons employed in civil capacities with the various departments of the Army, whose domicile is Asiatic or who, if their domicile is non-Asiatic, have not been specially recruited overseas for service in India:—
 - (i) all persons who enter or have entered or are or have been re-employed in Government service whether in a permanent or other capacity, on or after the 28th September 1931:
 - (ii) persons who were in service whether in a permanent or other capacity on the 27th September 1931, if there is a break in their service after that date. [A person reemployed under any of the re-employed Personnel (Conditions of Service) Rules shall be regarded as having had a break in his service];
 - (iii) persons who were on probation on the 27th September 1931, and who were subsequently confirmed in the service or post for which they were on probation, provided they were specifically warned at the time of appointment on probation that the leave rules were under revision;

- (iv) persons who entered service as a result of a competitive examination held before the 28th September 1931, provided they were specifically warned before or at the time of examination that the leave rules were under revision; and
- (v) persons who were in service as paid apprentices on the 27th September 1931, provided they were specifically warned at the time of appointment as apprentices that the leave rules were under revision.

For the purpose of these rules the term "Government service" shall be deemed to include prior service under Provincial Governments in India or under Local Funds administered by Government.

In the case of personnel transferred from a civil department to any department of the Army, "15th July 1931" and "16th July 1931" will be substituted for "27th September 1931" and "28th September 1931", respectively, wherever these dates occur in clauses (i) ot (v) above.

Persons transferred from the service of a local Government or from service under a Local Fund administered by Government, either direct to a department of the Army or after prior transfer to a civil department of the Government of India shall be deemed to have been specifically warned for the purposes of clauses (iii), (iv) or (v) if having been in probationary service under the local Government or under a Local Fund administered by Government on the 15th July 1931 or having entered the service of the local Government or the Local Fund as a result of a competitive examination held before the 16th July 1931 or having entered the service of the Local Government or Local Fund as paid apprentices before the 16th July 1931, they received from the Local Government or authorities of the Local Fund a warning of the nature mentioned in clauses (iii), (iv) or (v), as the case may be, with reference to the revision of leave rules by the local Government or Local Fund.

3. In these rules-

- "leave" includes earned leave, leave on private affairs, leave on medical certificate, and extraordinary leave;
- "earned leave" means leave earned in respect of periods spent at duty;
- "earned leave due" means the amount of earned leave calculated as prescribed in Rule 9 or Rule 10, diminished by the amount of earned leave taken;
- "Government servant in permanent employ" means a person who holds substantively a permanent post or who holds a lien on a permanent post or who would hold a lien on permanent post had the lien not been suspended.

- 4. Leave cannot be claimed as of right. Discretion is reserved to the authority empowered to grant leave, to refuse or revoke leave at any time according to the exigencies of the public service.
- 5. Unless otherwise decided by the Government of India an individual shall cease to be in Government service if he is continuously absent from duty for five years whether with or without leave, unless such absence is absence on foreign service in India.
- 6. Any kind of leave under these rules may be granted in combination with or in continuation of any other kind of leave.
- 7. No leave shall be granted beyond the date on which a Government servant must compulsorily retire;

Provided that the authority empowered to grant leave may allow a Government servant who has been denied in whole or in part on account of the exigencies of the public service the earned leave which was due to him pending retirement, the whole or any portion of the earned leave so denied, even though it extends to a date beyond the date on which such individual must compulsorily retire;

Provided further that a Government servant whose service has been extended in the interests of the public service beyond the date of his compulsory retirement may similarly be granted either within the period of extension or, if the conditions of the preceding proviso are satisfied, after its expiry, any earned leave which could have been granted to him under the preceding proviso had he retired on that date and in addition any earned leave due in respect of such extension.

- 8. Subject to the provisions of Rules 4 and 7, a Government servant may at any time be granted the whole or any part of the earned leave due to him.
- 9. The earned leave admissible to a Government servant in permanent employ is—
 - (a) to a Government servant of non-Asiatic domicile recruited in India and entitled to passage concessions, one-seventh;
 - (b) to a Government servant other than inferior not included in clause (a) above, one-eleventh; and
- (c) to a Government servant in inferior service, one-twenty-second; of the period spent on duty:

Provided that when the leave earned amounts to-

- (i) 150 days in the case of a Government servant in clause (a);
- (ii) 120 days in the case of a Government servant under clause (b) who is stationed at and proceeds on leave from a remote locality. (The places to be regarded as remote localities for this purpose will be determined by the Government of India).

- (iv) 30 days in the case of a Government servant in inferior service.

- 10. (a) The earned leave admissible to a Government servant not in permanent employ is, when he is not in inferior service, one-twenty-second of the period spent on duty, provided that when the earned leave due amounts to 30 days he will cease to earn such leave.
- (b) No earned leave is admissible to a Government servant in inferior service not in permanent employ,
- 11. A Government servant not in permanent employ appointed without interruption of duty subsequently to a permanent post will be credited with the earned leave which would have been admissible if his previous duty had been duty as a Government servant in permanent employ diminished by any earned leave already taken. Leave is not an interruption of duty for the purpose of this paragraph.
- 12. (a) Earned leave is not admissible to a Government servant in permanent employ serving in a vacation department in respect of duty performed in any year in which he avails himself of the full vacation.
- (b) The earned leave admissible to such a Government servant in respect of any year in which he is prevented from availing himself of the full vacation is such proportion of 30 days earned leave if he is in superior service, or of 15 days earned leave if he is in inferior service, as the number of days of vacation not taken bears to the full vacation.

If in any year he does not avail himself of the vacation, earned leave is admissible to him in respect of that year in accordance with the provisions of Rule 9.

- (c) Vacation may be taken in combination with or in continuation of any kind of leave under these rules, provided that the total duration of vacation and earned leave taken in conjunction, whether the earned leave is taken in combination with or in continuation of other leave or not, shall not exceed 90 days if the Government servant is in superior service or 30 days if he is in inferior service.
- (d) Earned leave is not admissible to a Government servant serving in a vacation department who is not in permanent employ.

- 13. Leave on private affairs may be granted only to a Government servant in permanent employ in superior service and to the following extent, namely:—
 - (a) If belonging to a Defence Service Class I or Class II, for 18 months in all and on any one occasion for not more than 3 months if spent wholly in Asia or for not more than 9 months if spent wholly outside Asia; if the leave is spent partly in and partly outside Asia, the period shall be 3 months plus such time as is actually spent outside Asia, subject to a maximum total period of 9 months.
 - (b) If belonging to a subordinate Defence Service for 12 months in all, and on any one occasion for not more than 3 months if spent wholly in Asia or for not more than 6 months if spent wholly outside Asia, if the leave is spent partly in and partly outside Asia, the period shall be three months plus such time as is actually spent outside Asia subject to a maximum total period of six months.

Note.—The question of classification of the Defence Services is under consideration. Pending final orders the Defence Services Class I and II will, for the purpose of this Rule, be held to include all Gazetted officers and other Government servants whose minimum pay of grade is not less than Rs. 125 per month and Subordinate Defence Service will be held to include all other Government servants not in inferior service.

14. Leave on medical certificate not exceeding 12 months in all during his service may be granted to a Government servant in permanent employ. Such leave shall be given only on production of a certificate from such medical authority as the Government of India may by general or special order specify in this behalf and for a period not exceeding that recommended by such medical authority.

Provided that when the maximum period of 12 months is exhausted further leave on medical certificate not exceeding six months in all may be granted in exceptional cases on the recommendations of a medical board.

- 15. (i) Extraordinary leave may be granted to any Government servant in special circumstances—
 - (a) when no other leave is by rule admissible, or
 - (b) when other leave is admissible, but the Government servant concerned applies in writing for the grant of extraordinary leave.
- (ii) Except in the case of a Government servant in permanent employ, the duration of extraordinary leave shall not exceed 3 months on any one occasion.

(iii) The authority empowered to grant leave may commute retrospectively periods of absence without leave into extraordinary leave.

Such authority may also commute retrospectively extraordinary leave granted into leave of a different kind which may be admissible, but that the Government servant concerned cannot claim it as a matter of right".

- 16. (i) A Government servant on earned leave is entitled—
- (a) if in permanent employ to leave salary equal to his average pay, or to his average substantive pay for the 12 complete months preceding the month in which leave is taken whichever is greater.
- (b) if not in permanent employ to leave salary equal to his pay on the day before the leave commences.
- (ii) A Government servant on leave on private affairs or leave on medical certificate is entitled to leave salary equal to half his average pay, or to half his average substantive pay for the 12 complete months preceding the month in which leave is taken, whichever is greater, subject in either case to a maximum of Rs. 750.
- (iii) A Government servant on extraordinary leave is not entitled to any leave salary.

For the purposes of this rule "average pay" means the average monthly pay earned during the 36 complete months preceding the month in which the event occurs which necessitates the calculation of average pay, and substantive pay means the pay of the permanent post which the Government servant holds substantively or on which he holds a lien or would hold a lien had the lien not been suspended.

Note.—The grant of leave under these rules to Government servants in inferior service is not subject to "no extra expense".

- 17. In recalculating the leave due or almissible to persons subject to these rules the leave already taken or sanctioned under the Civil Service Regulations or other regulations on or after 31st July 1935 shall be accounted for as follows:—
 - (i) privilege leave or leave on average pay, whether taken with or without medical certificate, against "earned leave".
 - (ii) leave on half average pay without medical certificate, against "leave on private affairs", and
 - (iii) leave on half average pay on medical certificate, against "leave on medical certificate".

The unavailed balance of leave earned under the Civil Service Regulations or other regulations prior to 31st July 1935, will be carried forward and will be regulated under these Rules. Cases of real hardship caused by such adjustment will be submitted to the Government of India for special consideration.

These rules will be embodied in the Regulations for Civilians of the Defence Services which are under consideration.

typhus fever.

The reservoir of this disease is believed to be rate, field-mice, squirrels etc., from which the disease is conveyed to man by the bites of blood sucking parasites such as ticks, fleas and mites. These parasites are normally present on the above animals, but during the monsoon period they migrate from their hosts and come to live upon grasses and plants, on the juices of which they feed. They remain infective, however, and are liable to give rise to the disease in man, should they bite him.

Jungle country, where there is much damp undergrowth, is especially dangerous and should be avoided as far as possible. On no account should individuals pass through such country with their

limbs bare.
