No. 14, BOUNDS—It should be made clear to all boys and girls, especially newcomers, that "Bounds" are not laid down from a desire to restrict their liberty nor because they are not trusted; Bounds are necessary in order that the School authorities may know where their charges are at any given moment and also that the best use may be made of the various playing grounds and other places within the school area.

Ordinarily, then, boys should keep to the Dharampore side of Sanawar and girls to the "Crater" side. Girls should not go beyond Hodson House at the one end or the School Office at the other without permission. The new tennis courts on the old Flat will only be used by those detailed by the Games Mistress, but the Head Matron will give permission to Upper School Girls to walk on the Long Back at her own discretion. When Roaming Bounds are given, the Head Matron and the Chief Instructor will, as they think best, vary the ordinary bounds for pairs or groups of children and permit them to go further afield. The only restriction in such cases is that no child must go far afield by itself and that some responsible person is aware of the direction the party proposes to take.

The Post Office is out of bounds to all boys and girls without special permission; so also are all staff quarters except those of a child's own Housemaster, Housemistress, Matron or Instructor. The Principal's House is in bounds at all times to those who wish to see him; other staff quarters are in bounds only to those children who have a definite errand.

The Tuck Shop is in bounds to those definitely going there on business; there should be no unnecessary loitering in the neighbourhood.

Boys having business at the school office should use the Main Road but otherwise the road is to be regarded as out of bounds.

All shops other than the school Tuck Shop are out of Bounds without permission; infringement of this particular rule will be regarded as very serious.

The general sense of this order is to be made clear to all boys and girls, especially newcomers and those joining the Senior School from the Junior School.

1. When the Fire Alarm is sounded on a bugle, it concerns only the Fire Brigade; all other departments or dormitories will be roused by repeated whistle blasts or by repeating ringing of a bell.

2. The Fire Brigade is under the command of Serjeant Flagg together with twelve boys. In the absence from the station of the Fire Brigade Commander, its charge devolves on the S. S. I. on duty. A nominal roll of the Fire Brigade will be posted on the B. D. notice-board and kept up to date.

3. On the Fire Alarm sounding, the Fire Brigade will at once double to the Quadrangle and fall in under the Fire Brigade Commander. If the Alarm sounds between Lights Out and Reveille, members of the Brigade will parade in sleeping suits, cardigans and running shoes. Practices at regular intervals will be carried out under the direction of the Chief Instructor who is responsible for the custody of the fire-fighting apparatus and for ensuring that every member of the Fire Brigade knows his duties.

The Fire Alarm will only be sounded under orders from the Principal, Medical Officer, School Secretary, Chief Instructor or the Fire Brigade Commander.

4. Should a fire break out in Birdwood School during School Hours, the Senior Master or Mistress present will have the School bell rung continuously; children will at once leave their form rooms under the direction of staff and in an orderly manner. They will fall in facing the School Building and await further orders. The same applies, with a few obvious changes, to an outbreak in Number 5.

5. An outbreak of fire must at once be reported to the nearest member of Staff or Prefect. If it occurs during the day and the building is an occupied one it must be immediately cleared of all occupants and the senior member present is responsible that the Fire Brigade is immediately informed.

If an outbreak of fire occurs at night in any building where school-children are sleeping, the senior matron or other adult in charge will immediately rouse all the occupants of the building by a vigorous ringing of a bell (Girls and Juniors) or blowing of a whistle (Boys). Children so roused are to put their sandals or shoes on their feet, put their top blanket round themselves and then fall in at a pre-arranged spot well clear of the building. Section leaders (Seniors) or Matrons (Sparrowhawks and Juniors) are at once to count the children and see that they are all present; it is not enough merely to see that beds are empty, though this should be done also.

Some responsible person, Staff or Prefect, must be warned to take charge of the assembly while the person in charge of the building will go through every dormitory and bathroom to see that the place is all clear.

At the same time and as soon as the outbreak is detected some reliable individual should have been despatched to summon the Fire Brigade. (This applies to a real outbreak but not necessarily to practices). A senior boy or girl should do for this duty and one such should be permanently appointed each year for each building, *i. e.* one for each of Numbers 9, 10, 11, 12, 50, Holiday House etc.

Two or three fire practices are to be carried out yearly; the person in charge of a building is also responsible for fire precautions there and for carrying out these practices. The first practice each year should be done in daylight but at least one a year is to be carried out at night.

6. The Medical Officer is responsible for fire precautions in the Hospital; in collaboration with the Nursing Sister he will ensure that two probationers are attached to each of the Boys, Girls and Infectious wards whose first duty, on an alarm of fire, will be to clear the wards, carrying bed patients where necessary. The first step, however, should be to send a message to the coolie lines and the second to notify the Principal. Two men from the staff of hospital servants should be instructed in the use of the Minimax.

7. The Quartermaster will draw up his own rules for dealing with an outbreak in Stores and for the salvage of Government property. The School Secretary will, likewise, draw up rules for dealing with an outbreak in the Office.

8. Should a fire break out in any Staff Quarter, a servant should be despatched with a brief written note to the Serjeant Instructor on duty who will assemble the Fire Brigade and deal with the out-break. At the same time, all school or private servants in the locality of the Quarter should attempt to put the fire out and salvage property. The Principal should be notified as soon as possible.

9. As soon as possible after term begins, the Chief Instructor will detail boys for the Fire Brigade while he and the Matrons in charge of buildings will explain carefully to their children what they are to do in case of fire.

10. Every attempt must be made to salvage Government property but this must be done by employing school coolies and other labour marshalled for the purpose. In no circumstances, will children be employed on this work or allowed to enter a burning building.

Amendments to Standing Orders (Medical).

Duties of Nursing Sister.

1. She is responsible for the cleanliness of the Hospital wards and their adjacent offices, and also for the Nurses Home.

2. She is responsible for the Nursing, Cleanliness and Discipline of all in-patients. She will acquaint them with the Rules she makes for maintaining discipline in the wards. A copy of such rules will be posted in the anteroom to the wards.

3. She is responsible for the Discipline and Routine of the Indian staff employed exclusively in her part of the Hospital.

4. *Treatment of patients.*—She will ensure that all treatments as ordered by the Medical Officer or his assistant on the Case-sheets are efficiently carried out.

She will also give any *emergency* or symptomatic treatment, which in the immediate absence of the Medical Officer or his assistant may become necessary, but she will note down, initial, and date such treatment on the Case-sheet.

She will acquaint the Medical Officer or his assistant with any case of more than ordinary gravity and of all *accident cases* that may be brought to Hospital after the Medical Officer has left his office.

She will on no account allow any patient to leave its bed, unless so instructed on the Case-sheet; and then only up to the time prescribed. She may, however, permit convalescent patients to leave the precincts of the Hospital when marked on the Case-sheet. "Allowed to Dress". The Medical Officer or Sub-charge, alone, may mark on the Case-sheet when a case may get up from bed, be dressed, and become discharged.

5. *Diets.*—She will ensure that each patient receives the correct class of Diet as recorded on the Case-sheet, and will see for herself that the food is adequately cooked and properly served; and that whenever possible, all Up-patients take their meals together at table.

6. *Nurses' Training etc.*—She is responsible for the Discipline, Tidiness, and Instruction of the Probationer Nurses, and will report any more than ordinary breach of discipline to the Medical Officer, or in his absence the Principal.

She will instruct the nurses from 9 to 10 a.m., three days a week unless pressure of work in the wards forbids, when this duty may be postponed.

She will acquaint the Medical Officer in writing on the 30th of each month with such instruction as she has given and will at the same time submit to him their Note-books for perusal. In November an examination on the year's work will be conducted by the Sister and Medical Officer.

7. *Drugs and equipment.*—She will be responsible for all drugs issued to the wards; and will keep under lock and key, any that are dangerous.

She is also responsible for all ward and theatre equipment, and all bedstock under her charge or issued to her, and will bring to the notice of the Medical Officer any loss or damage that may occur. She will keep a Breakage Book and present this to the Medical Officer for signature on the 30th of each month.

8. She will put up in the anteroom to the wards a list of the individual duties of each nurse for the month and will submit a copy to the Medical Officer so that he may know who has the care of each section of the Hospital.

9. The Nursing Sister will come on duty at 7-45 a. m.

10. If she goes out she will warn the Probationer on duty; informing her where she may be found in case of emergency. The Probationer on Duty will act for her in her absence.

Should the Sister go out of Sanawar or be not easily available, she will arrange that the Matron in charge of the Hospital Kitchen be in authority.

11. As far as possible she will once a week hand the Sub-charge a list of dressings required for the wards and theatre.

12. She will arrange that all wards who are able, shall write to their parents on Saturday. She will inspect these letters and send them to the School Secretary for postage on Monday.

Duties of Matron in charge of hospital kitchen.

1. Besides those usual duties associated with the charge of a kitchen, she will have the immediate supervision of the nurses' quarters and clothing.

2. She will supervise the issue of the principal meals, and will see that breakfast in the wards is properly served.

3. She will come on duty 15 minutes before breakfasts are served.

4. She will supervise the nurses' meals.

5. She will deputise for the Sister when the latter goes out of the station, or is not easily available, and if not in the hospital will notify the Probationer on Duty where she may at once be found.

Duties of Sub-charge.

1. In the absence of the Medical Officer he will be in the position of the Medical Officer.

2. He will come on duty at 8 a.m. daily, except on Sundays, when he will start duty at 8-45. He will inspect the quality of the rations three times a week and will take M. I. Rooms in turn with the Medical Officer at the times laid down in school orders from time to time. From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. he will be at hospital, and again from 4-30 to 5-30 p.m.

3. He will treat all Indian personnel, and such European staff as come to him for minor ailments. He will also supervise the running of the Indian hospital.

4. He will have the maintenance of records, and routine office work.

5. He will attend such functions as ceremonial parades, and boxing, swimming, and running contests, where there are possibilities of a casualty.

6. He will not leave the station without previously informing the Medical Officer.

Duties of Dispenser.

1. He will come on duty daily at 8 a.m. (8-45 a.m. Sundays) and will ensure that the M. I. Rooms are punctually opened and are clean and properly stocked. He will see that the "Attending" Bag is complete. He will assist the Medical Officer or Subcharge at the M. I. Rooms, and will be at Hospital from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 4-30 to 5-30 p.m. (except on Sundays and holidays).

2. Calls marked urgent will be attended to at once.

3. No drugs, stock or otherwise, will be given out without reference to the Medical Officer or his assistant. He will keep a careful record of all private prescriptions dispensed, with the date and time of issue, and will keep a register of all Indian out-patients that attend.

4. On the 30th of each month he will hand the subcharge a list of drugs required at the dispensary, and will make out the necessary expense vouchers on the drugs being issued.

5. He will be responsible for the tidiness and cleanliness of the Dispensary, Stores, Outpatient room, Medical Officer's office, Subcharge's office, Dark room and Dental room.

Probationer-Nurses.

1. Their duties and hours will be arranged by the Sister, who will post her orders up in the Anteroom to the wards.

2. All those on duty will be in their respective parts of the hospital when the Medical Officer makes his round.

3. Nurses, including night-nurses, when *off-duty* will wear their undress uniform, and will on no account wear ward uniform unless on duty. When on duty either within or without the hospital precincts they will at all times be properly dressed and *will wear caps*.

4. At school functions, when not on duty, they will be properly attired in undress uniform and *will wear hats*.

5. A nurse will, except when pressure of hospital work forbids, attend at G. S. and J. S. M. I. Rooms, both morning and evening, except on Sundays and school holidays.

General.

1. Ward Rounds will take place daily, except Sundays, at 10-15 a. m.

The sweepers will be on duty at this time. On Thursdays there will also be an inspection of the Hospital at 11 a.m.

2. Discharges will be made at 2 p.m. when Junior school children will be escorted back to their Department by a nurse, or if available the Attending Orderly.

3. Admissions and Discharges will be noted on the Sick Report Book by the Attending Orderly and the Book be sent daily to the Principal for signature. A similar list will be sent to the Senior Master daily at noon by the Subcharge.
