Sanawar mourns with India and the World the passing of Mahatma Gandhi. His life, so pure in all its aspects, shone out as a beacon light in a world enshrouded by the mists of suspicion, greed, intolerance and strife. To him all men were one. He knew no barriers of caste or creed. He was the servant of all mankind. India and the World can ill afford to lose so noble a figure. But though Mahatma's mortal remains are now no more than ashes his spirit and his teachings will remain for all time. It will be remembered that a former Principal of Sanawar, C. F. Andrews, was for many years closely associated with him. The Mahatma's loss is irreparable but, if everyone carries out the injunctions of the Prime Minister and other leaders, out of the foul and dastardly deed of a single madman will come that peace and good-will amongst all sections and communities of India for which the Mahatma made the greatest of all sacrifices.

**I. In Rule 7 of the said Rules—**

(1) In the proviso to sub-rule (4), for the words, figures and brackets “sub-rules (1) to (3)” the words “this rule” shall be substituted.

(2) For sub-rules (5) and (6), the following sub-rules shall be substituted, namely :—

“ (5) (a) A subscriber may provide in a nomination in respect of any specified nominee that in the event of his predeceasing the the subscriber, the right conferred upon that nominee shall pass to such other person as may be specified in the nomination ;

(b) That the nomination shall become invalid in the event of the happening of a contingency, specified therein ; provided that if at the time of making the nomination the subscriber has no family, he shall provide in the nomination that it shall become invalid in the event of his subsequently acquiring a family.

(6) Immediately on the death of a nominee in respect of whom no special provision has been made in the nomination under clause (a) of sub-rule (5) or on the occurrence of any event by reason of which the nomination becomes invalid in pursuance of clause (b) of sub-rule (5) or the proviso thereto, the subscriber shall send to the Accounts Officer a notice in writing cancelling the nomination, together with a fresh nomination made in accordance with the provisions of this rule”.

4. Luggage of children leaving Sanawar must be ready by 8-00 a. m. on 18th December.

Boxes should be labelled with the owner's name, address and destination and so arranged that all labels show in the same direction at the end of the box. Labels will be supplied to Departments by the Office. All labelled boxes will be collected by School coolies, loaded on the lorry and transported to Dharampore. Boxes will be stacked as under.

Boys' School, Gymnasium Verandah.

Junior School, No. 10 Verandah.

Girls' School, No. 9 Verandah.

5. Children leaving Sanawar must be in possession of holiday slips. These will be issued to Departments from the Office.

6. Children going on leave will hand in all Govt. property in their possession personally to Matrons who will check it and if correct issue a Check slip. This slip will be presented to Head Matrons or Senior Master by whom alone holiday slips will be given out. Passes will not be issued until Government clothes are handed in. In the case of children being escorted home the holiday slip must be given to the escort.

Any Government clothes lost will be entered on the check slip and the slip sent to the Office to effect recovery of the cost of the articles.

No school bedding, clothing, or other Government property may be taken away from Sanawar unless written permission is given by the Principal. This rule is to be strictly enforced.

7. Children will travel only in those carriages assigned to them by the Railway authorities.

8. Staff who wish their heavy baggage transported by the School should have it ready by 8 a. m. on December 18th. They must notify the Assistant Secretary as to the number of packages they have.

9. The School accepts no responsibility for lost luggage, and Staff and children alike should supervise the loading of their boxes.

10. Travelling money and pocket money will be disbursed by Housemasters and Housemistresses at times convenient to them. Money for all departments will be sent to the House Staff as early as possible.

11. The Principal and the Vice-Principal will be in Office between 9-00 a. m. and 12-30 a. m. on Home Day to see parents.

No. 301, LABELS—Luggage labels and holiday passes will be issued to Departments on 14th December.

No. 302, LIGHTS—Staff should ensure that electric lights are switched off in their bungalows before they leave for the holiday.

No. 303, STAFF—Before leaving the station Staff must enter their names in the address book at the Office. Keys of quarters should be labelled and sent to the Assistant Secretary. Heads of Departments will ensure that this Order is perfectly clear to all members of their Staff.

No. 304, STOCK-SCHOOL BOOKS—Form staff should make a careful check of all books. Cupboards should be locked. Keys should be labelled and given in to Mr. Cuzen at the Stock Room.

There are no exceptions to this rule and I shall be inspecting cupboards during the vacation.

No. 305, STOCK LEDGERS—Staff should send their Stock Ledgers and Indent Books to the Office at the end of term. These may be required by the Auditors during the holidays.

No. 306, PAY RECEIPTS—Staff are asked to return pay receipts to the Office without delay during the vacation. Failure to do so will result in delay in later payments.

No. 307, O. S. SOCIETY—House Staff are invited to draw the attention of children leaving School to the O. S. Society, the life subscription to which is Re. 1/-

No. 308, DISCIPLINE—All children travelling in School parties are subject to School discipline until handed over to parents or guardians.

No. 309, POCKET-MONEY BOOKS—Housemistresses should return their Pocket money books to Office at the end of term.

No. 310, FOOD—Great care must be taken by escorts to ensure that any food bought by children on their journey home is obtained only from reputable vendors or at accredited Refreshment Rooms.

No. 311, TRAVEL—Children who are being escorted home and whose names, therefore, will not appear on the School party list must in no circumstances be permitted to leave Sanawar unless their escorts call for them. The only exceptions to this rule will be senior children going to Kasauli.

No. 312, STOCK—The end of term is, I know, a very busy time for all of us but I want all Stock-holders to exercise the greatest possible check on stocks held by them. Should there be any losses a full explanation must be given as to how they have occurred. There should be a complete stock-taking in all sections of the School before term closes and Heads of Departments and Stock-holders will be responsible to me for ensuring that stock is correct and adequately safeguarded for the vacation.

No. 313, BREAD—Staff wishing to discontinue their supply of bread during the Christmas Vacation should notify the Assistant Secretary by 13th December, 1948, giving the dates between which they do not wish to be supplied.

No. 314, LIBRARIES—Books borrowed from the Girls' and Staff Libraries should be returned by December 13th and December 15th respectively.

No. 315, CORRIGENDUM FUEL—School Order No. 269 of the 19th November, 1948, should be amended to read as follows :—

*read* coal 90 lbs. and wood 6 lbs.
