- 6. Children will hand in all School property in their possession personally to matrons who will check it and, if correct, issue a Check Slip. This Slip will be presented to Housemaster/Housemistresses, who will Check that they receive Slips of all children in their Houses.

Any School clothes lost will be entered on the Check Slip and the Slip sent to the Office to effect recovery of the cost of the articles. Children must sign for losses.
