- No. 2, WELCOME—The Principal would like to welcome to Sanawar all members of the Staff and the children and would like to wish them a very happy and successful term in School.
- No. 3, SCHOOL PROGRAMME—All departments will observe Sunday timings till March 5th. Assembly on 1st, 2nd and 3rd March will be at 9-45 a. m. Prep. and P. T. will start on and from Monday, 13th March. Supper will be at 5-45 p. m. daily.
- No. 4, TEXT BOOKS AND STATIONERY—After Assembly and the reading of the Form Lists on March 1st, children, under Form Staff, will assemble in their Form Rooms. Text Books only will be issued.

Subject Masters will be responsible for issuing the required number of text books and exercise books to their Forms. If more than one text book is prescribed for English the minimum requirement will be issued. Subsequent issues will be made when the preliminary issue is returned to the Stock Room.

Subject Masters will keep a record of text books issued to the children, and will record the state of the books issued (i.e. old, new) on the special Form supplied by the Librarian. This procedure is important, as recoveries will have to be effected at the end of the year from the children concerned if books have been misused or mutilated.

Form Staff will collect their requirements of stationery from the Librarian in the first School on 2nd March, after Assembly.

No. 5, PROCEDURE—On arrival all old children will report to the matrons concerned and hand over their medical slips to them. These medical slips will be forwarded to the R. M. O. by the House Masters/Mistresses on 27th February, 1961. Any children without medical slips or who appear unwell will be sent to the R. M. O.

Spraying of throats will be done daily until further orders.

No. 6, RECEPTION—New admissions will be made on 25th, 27th and 28th February, and again from 6th to 15th March, 1961. All new parents on their arrival will be guided to the Parents' Rooms. Hot water and tea will be made available for them on their arrival. Quartermaster will arrange for hot water, and Mrs. Sehgal for tea, in the Parents' Rooms.

Mr. Jagdish Ram will be on duty from 9-00 a. m. to 1-00 p. m. in the Parents' Rooms to guide the parents, on the Reception dates.

From the Parents' Rooms, parents, together with their luggage, will be taken to the Office. After the medical examination new children will be sent to the dormitories.

- No. 7, LATE ARRIVALS—Ail Housemasters/Housemistresses are requested to report late arrivals, among the older children, together with their explanations for late arrival. If children arrive late for reasons which are not covered by a Medical Certificate or the Principal's sanction, disciplinary action will be taken against them as under:—

No. 245, TEACHERS TRAINING BURSARIES IN THE U. K. IN 1962-63:-

The following bursaries are available:-

- (a) One-year course for experienced Teacher Educator at the Primary stage.
- (b) One-year course for the teaching of English as a second language.
- (c) One-year course in Science.

The personal and maintenance grant offered by the U.K. Government will be sufficient to meet the day-to-day needs of candidates in the U.K., but will not permit of any remittances being made to the candidate's family or dependants in India.

The sponsoring institution, namely this School, must undertake to grant candidates leave and adequate leave salary, this will be half pay study leave according to the rules, to enable the family or the dependants to maintain themselves in India.

The cost of passages to and from the U. K. is to be met by the institution sponsoring candidates. This the School regrets its inability to provide at present.

Recommendations are to be submitted by me to the Ministry of Education by 25th November, 1961.

 - (c) The question of recognition by Madras will be taken up for consideration after two or three years' experience has been gained, and the standard of the new examination is known. At present Madras recognises this examination as equivalent to the Matriculation Examination of its University.
